The **Filipiniana Collection** consists of materials related to the Philippines, its history, culture, literature, and people. This guide aims to help users understand the scope, organization, and usage of Filipiniana resources in the library.

Organization and Location

- The Filipiniana Collection is housed on the 3rd floor of the Fr. Jose T. Bacatan SJ, Library.
- Materials are classified using the Library of Congress Classification (LCC) system.
- Rare and special Filipiniana materials may be in a restricted-access area and require permission for use.

Scope and Coverage Filipiniana Collection includes:

- Books authored by Filipino writers
- Works about the Philippines (history, culture, politics, economy, society, etc.)
- Publications by Philippine-based publishers
- Government publications and reports
- Theses and dissertations related to Philippine studies
- Rare books and archival materials

Borrowing and Access Policies

Filipiniana materials are available for use by all library patrons, with specific circulation rules depending on the format and rarity of the material:

- General Filipiniana Collection: These materials can be borrowed by patrons for seven (7) days but are not renewable
- **Reference Filipiniana Collection:** These materials are for room use only.
- Rare or Special Filipiniana Collection: These materials are for in-library use only and must be accessed under supervision in designated areas.

MINDANO COLLECTION

The **Mindanao Collection** aims to preserve and provide access to materials that pertain to the history, culture, people, and development of Mindanao.

Borrowing and Access Policies

- General Materials: Materials in the Mindanao Collection are for in-library use only. However, books with multiple copies may be borrowed by faculty/ staff for one week, with renewals allowed if no other requests are pending. Only one copy of a title may be borrowed at a time
- Rare and Special Collections: Items of historical significance or rarity within the Mindanao Section are considered non-circulating and must be used within the library's special collections or designated reading room.
