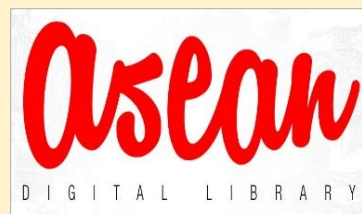

Acta Medica Philippina (actamedicaphilippina.upm.edu.ph) is a peer-reviewed general medical and health science journal that published by the University of the Philippines Manila, and publishes original scientific papers in the field of basic and clinical medical or health-related research.



ArXiv.org (arxiv.org) is a free distribution service and an open-access archive for 2,193,919 scholarly articles in the fields of physics, mathematics, computer science, quantitative biology, quantitative finance, statistics, electrical engineering and systems science, and economics. ArXiv is managed by Cornell University.



ASEAN Digital Library (www.aseanlibrary.org) National Libraries from the various countries in ASEAN hold a great wealth of library resources that span the spectrum of formats – books, papers and manuscripts, maps, photographs, paintings and drawings, audio and video recordings, ephemera, and newspapers.



Bielefeld Academic Search Engine (BASE) (www.base-search.net/) is one of the world's most voluminous search engines especially for academic web resources. BASE provides more than 300 million documents from more than 10,000 content providers. Bielefeld University Library operates BASE.

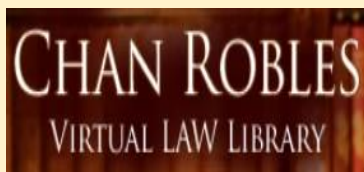

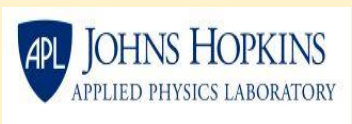
